

Laser Hair Removal:

Laser Hair Removal is one of the most common cosmetic procedures in the U.S. It beams highly concentrated light into hair follicles. Pigment in the follicles absorb the light, which destroys the hair. Areas for Laser Hair Removal:

Pricing:

The cost of this procedure is based on the size of the area being treated.

- · Small Area Chin, Neck, Underarms is \$100
- · Medium Area Upper Arms, Lower Arms, Lower Legs is \$200
- · Large Area Full Legs, Full Arms, Full Back is \$300

Pre-Procedure:

- Avoid sun exposure and tanning beds for at least 4 weeks prior to your treatment. No exceptions will be made.
- · Avoid applying self-tanner for 2 weeks prior to treatment.
- Avoid taking aspirin and ibuprofen for one week prior to your treatment. Inform the doctor or aesthetician if you are taking blood thinners or regularly take aspirin or ibuprofen.
- · Avoid alcohol for 2 days prior to treatment.
- Inform the doctor if have taken Accutane in the past year.
- · Store ice packs in your freezer for use after your procedure.

Day of the Procedure:

- If possible, arrive without creams or make-up on the treatment area. Otherwise, please arrive IO minutes prior to your appointment in order to clean the skin. Cleansing products are available for your convenience.
- · Allow 30 to 60 minutes for your appointment depending on the size of the treatment area.
- · Just prior to treatment, you will be given eye shields or goggles to wear to protect your eyes.

Post-Procedure:

- Expect your skin to appear pink, resembling mild sunburn, for a few hours after treatment.
- · A cool compress will be provided after treatment if needed.
- · Makeup may be applied to cover redness as needed.

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What to Expect:

- · Your skin may be temperature sensitive for several days after treatment.
- Blistering and crusting are rare; however, if these do occur, a thin layer of over-the counter antibiotic ointment such as Polysporin® can be applied 2 to 3 times a day for 3 days. Please call us at 817-503-2442 if you experience either of these uncommon reactions.
- Hyper-pigmentation, darkening of the skin color, can occur in some skin types. Please call us if you experience this uncommon reaction.

Home Aftercare:

- · Use mild cleansers and moisturizers.
- · Avoid aspirin, ibuprofen, alcohol, exertion and strenuous activities for 2 days after treatment.
- · Avoid harsh topical products such as retinols and glycolic acid products for I week.
- Avoid direct sunlight on the treated area, and use broad spectrum UVA/UVB sunscreen with an SPF 30 or greater for 4 to 6 weeks after your treatment.
- · Anticipate some social downtime following the treatment.

Results:
